### WOMEN'S GROUP

Stamps are becoming harder and harder to come by, for a variety of reasons. In March, the Women's Group clipped and sorted 145 stamps. And in April, we did 167 stamps. But that pales in comparison to May of last year (2022) when we sent 1,100 stamps! When you bring in your mail, please check for stamps. Spanish-speaking children can be taught about Jesus by you giving stamps. The stamps are sold and the money helps to publish Sunday School materials in Spanish. Please keep the children and the good news of Jesus in mind.

River Blindness collected \$20 in April. And we are learning of yet another eye disease that you can help by dropping your coins (or dollar bills) in the plastic container by the steps near the doors to the sanctuary. First, we learned of River Blindness caused by flies, then cataracts, and now a highly contagious disease called Trachoma, which causes



a person's eye lashes to grow inward and scratch the eye until it is blind. In desperation, people take tweezers and painfully try to pull out their eye lashes to prevent going blind. But a simple surgical procedure for \$22 can correct the problem permanently. So this month, we almost gathered enough for one person to have this procedure done. Keep your eyes open and aware of coins to that we can help others to keep their eyesight.
