only stamps that the Alliance can use are **actual, physical stamps**, not ones that are simply printed onto the paper. If you can't feel the stamp, they can't use it. This is a change from years past. So be very vigilant. Watch for any possible stamps and bring them each Sunday to put into the basket in the church office.

And \$10 in coins was added to the River Blindness initiative. These funds go to help the poorest of the poor in Africa so that they can prevent blindness, be useful and independent, and not rely on begging, even the children. Our coins can do so much. So put your coins to good use and drop them into the container



at the foot of the steps by the sanctuary. Lets not waste even our "leftover" coins.
