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NEW MINISTRY OPPORTUNITY!

There comes a time when all of us could use a meal, a hug, and/or some company. SBRC is looking to start a new Outreach Ministry - "Food for the Soul". This ministry will provide meals to church families who have experienced the recent loss of a loved one. Once the funeral is over, family and friends make their ways home, but survivors could use some short-term additional support. "Food for the Soul" seeks to help by providing meals, visits, and/or comfort for a week or two following the funeral. We are seeking volunteers to help with this project!

However, there are some ground rules:

- 1. Once a need is known, a "Food for the Soul" Sign up Genius will be sent to volunteers. This will be the only way to sign up!
- 2. If you commit to making a meal, you <u>MUST</u> follow through and provide the meal.
- 3. You MUST deliver the food (address will be provided).
- 4. If you decide to provide a delivered meal (DoorDash, UberEats, local pizzeria, etc.), you are responsible for paying for it yourself.

TREASURER'S NOTES

As predicted, this summer followed the pattern of summers past. Attendance dropped as did the donations. Thank you to all that maintained their financial commitment online, by mail or in person. However, without everyone's support we could not remain in the black.

We started June, \$3,124 in the black. Pledges totaled close to \$9,700, which is not that great considering there were five Sundays this month. Besides our regular expenses, we made several large quarterly payments. We ended June, \$3,472 in the red.

July donations were down by \$1,700 compared to the previous month. Expenses were normal with no large, unexpected bills. We ended July, \$3,756 in the red.

But the situation is not hopeless. If we all work together, we can get our current expense budget back in the black by fall. Catch up on those back pledges. Pay your classis assessment of \$100 per member if you haven't done so already. Come out and support our upcoming ham dinner. When we all work together, we can and do accomplish great things.

WOMEN'S GROUP

"As scarce as hen's teeth" is an old saying, but it's becoming truer every day when thinking about stamps. They're becoming harder and harder to find. Please be watchful as you bring in your mail, and bring any stamps to church. These stamps help to raise money to print Sunday School materials in Spanish. As of the end of May of 2023, the Alliance Stamp Ministry has sold these kinds of stamps and raised \$11,000 for printing costs. Just realize that your stamps could help a child come to know Jesus. What could be more special than that? The Women's Group will once again be clipping and sorting stamps beginning on September 17th after church during coffee hour. All are welcome to participate.

And just as stamps are becoming more difficult to find, so are coins that we use to fund River Blindness. We gathered \$20 in coins for June and \$10 for July. That may not seem to be much, but our coins go much farther in helping people in Africa to provide medicine to prevent river blindness, perform cataract surgery on children and adults, and provide glasses. Be aware of how much your few coins can do and drop them into the container outside the sanctuary doors. God can bless these few coins just like He did to the loaves and the fish.
