


Holiday Lights Hayride

175TH ANNIVERSARY EVENTS & FUNDRAISING PLANS

Our 175th Anniversary Event is fast approaching, and the Committee members have been working on ideas to mark and celebrate the special year. Having overcome so many happy, sad, challenging and rewarding events in our history, we have so much to celebrate.

We've settled on a few events to be held between September 2024 and May 2025 which include:

Homecoming Sunday, September 22, 2024, at 10:00 – Sunday service and catered luncheon

Choir and Bell Choir Concert and Reception, February 23, 2025; Rain date March 2, 2025

Anniversary Service, Sunday, May 18, 2025 – 2:00pm and Dinner Dance in evening 4 – 9:00pm

To help defray the costs and make these events affordable to all, our Fundraising Committee has some ideas to begin start raising money.

\$175 Challenge: Beginning in November we are suggesting the **\$175 Challenge.** This plan is like our "Wall of Giving Challenge". Each member of our congregation who would like to participate can take an envelope marked "175th Challenge" at the entrance into the sanctuary and can donate \$5 each Sunday for 35



Sundays which totals \$175 or enclose any amount they choose. This, like all fundraisers, is completely voluntary. Donate what you can. Any donation helps to make these events affordable for all in the end. We'll track the donation dollars on the bulletin board in the hallway. For tax recording, please write your name on the envelope before dropping it into the collection plate. Donations can also be made via on-line donations.

Ice Cream: SBRC will sell "ice cream of the month" for \$12 per quart. Flavors will change each month and will be announced the month prior to delivery. Prepay for your order with Debbie Norz (or any fundraising committee member - Irene Foley, Gillian Green, Nancy Murray) and allow 2 weeks prior to delivery date. This fundraiser will likely start at the beginning of the new year.

Talent Auction: Church members offer up a talent or service for auction on a specific Sunday (to be determined). It can be cooking a special dinner or dessert, rides to the airport, boat ride, babysitting etc. During Coffee Hour that Sunday, congregation members may bid on a talent or service they would like to receive. The highest bidder wins the service.



Calendar Raffle – Purchase tickets for a set price and a committee member will draw names each weekday for 12 weeks to win dollar amounts that vary on each day. You could win \$10 on Tuesday and \$20 on Friday. If your name is drawn, it goes right back into the pool. It is not excluded from future drawings.

Dine to Donate: This is always an easy way to raise funds. Just make a purchase of food at a participating restaurant during the agreed upon date/time (likely to occur during a weeknight). That business will donate 10% of profits for the purchase to South Branch Reformed Church.

So many fundraising options were discussed. These were voted as the most popular and easiest to execute. We hope you'll participate not only in the fundraising but especially in the special events. Any funds raised more than what is needed will be donated to the church's general fund.
